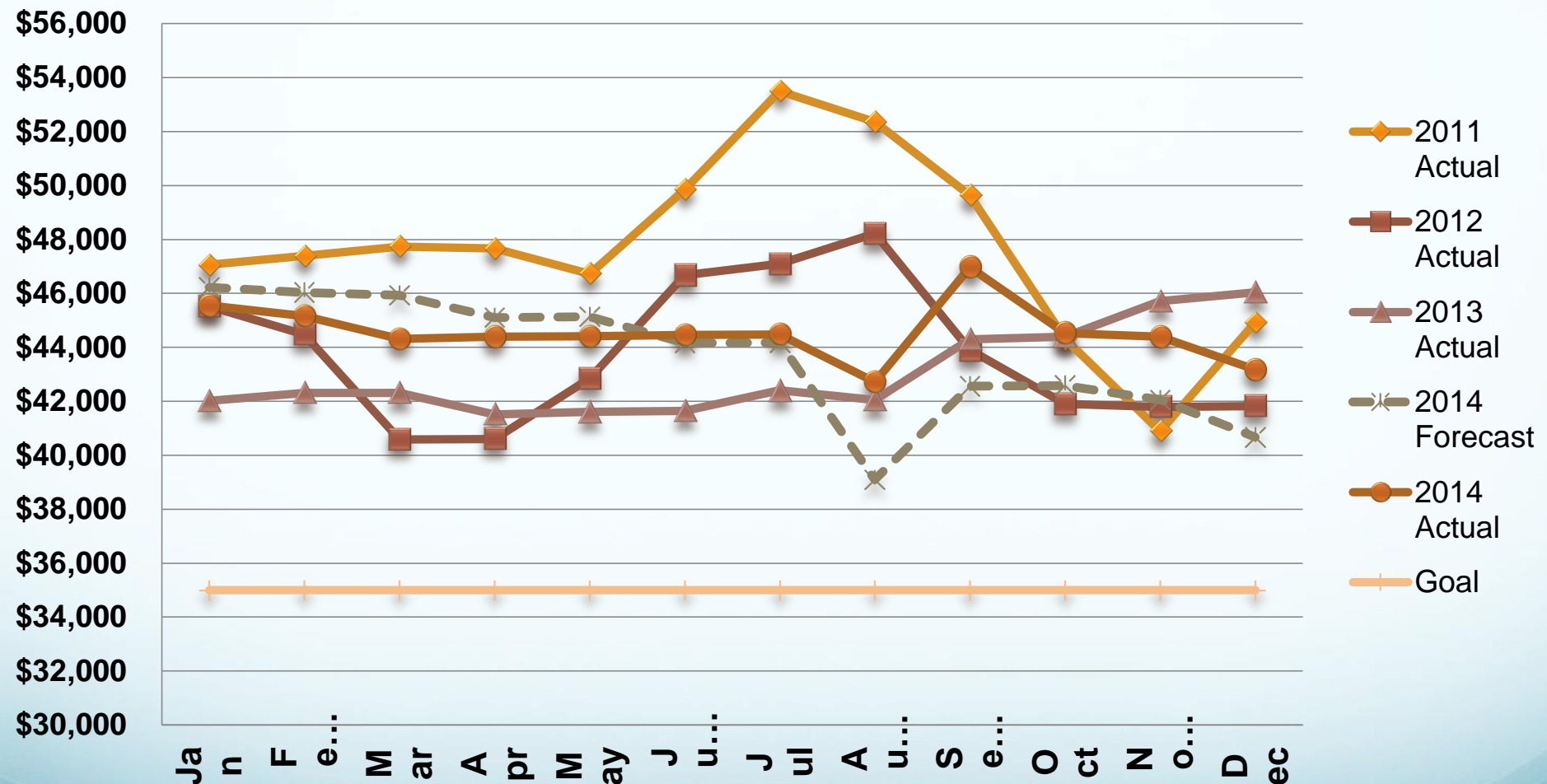
A Word from our Incoming 2015-2016 President Irene Stith

- × FTC joined the Ridgway Chamber of Commerce showing our support for our community.

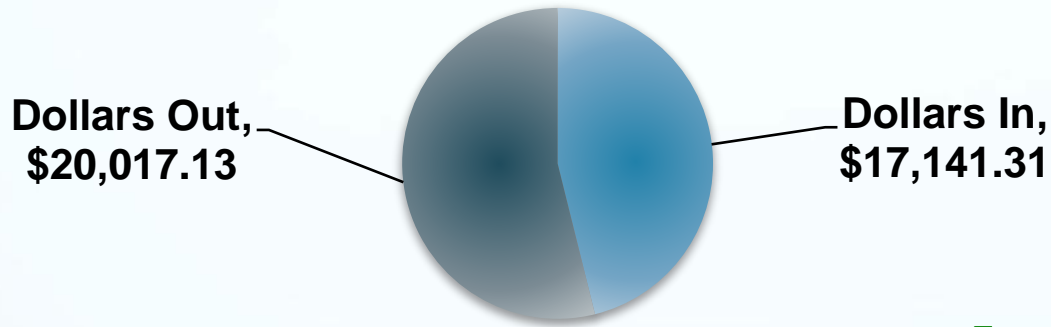
Fortuna Tierra Club 2014 Cash On Hand



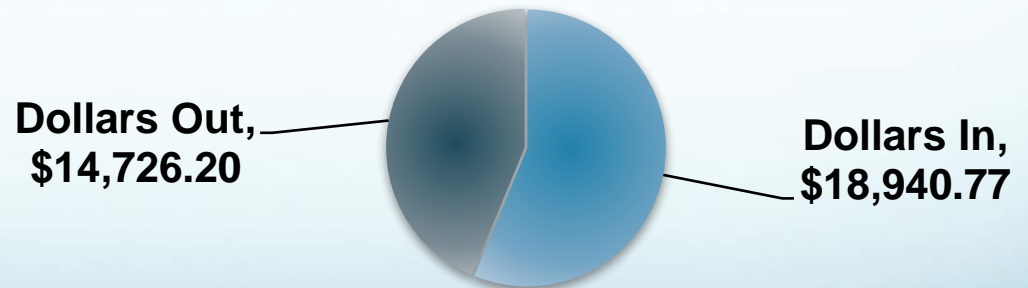
- Closed Cash on hand \$2,491 above forecast for 2014 year.

Dollars In/Dollars Out

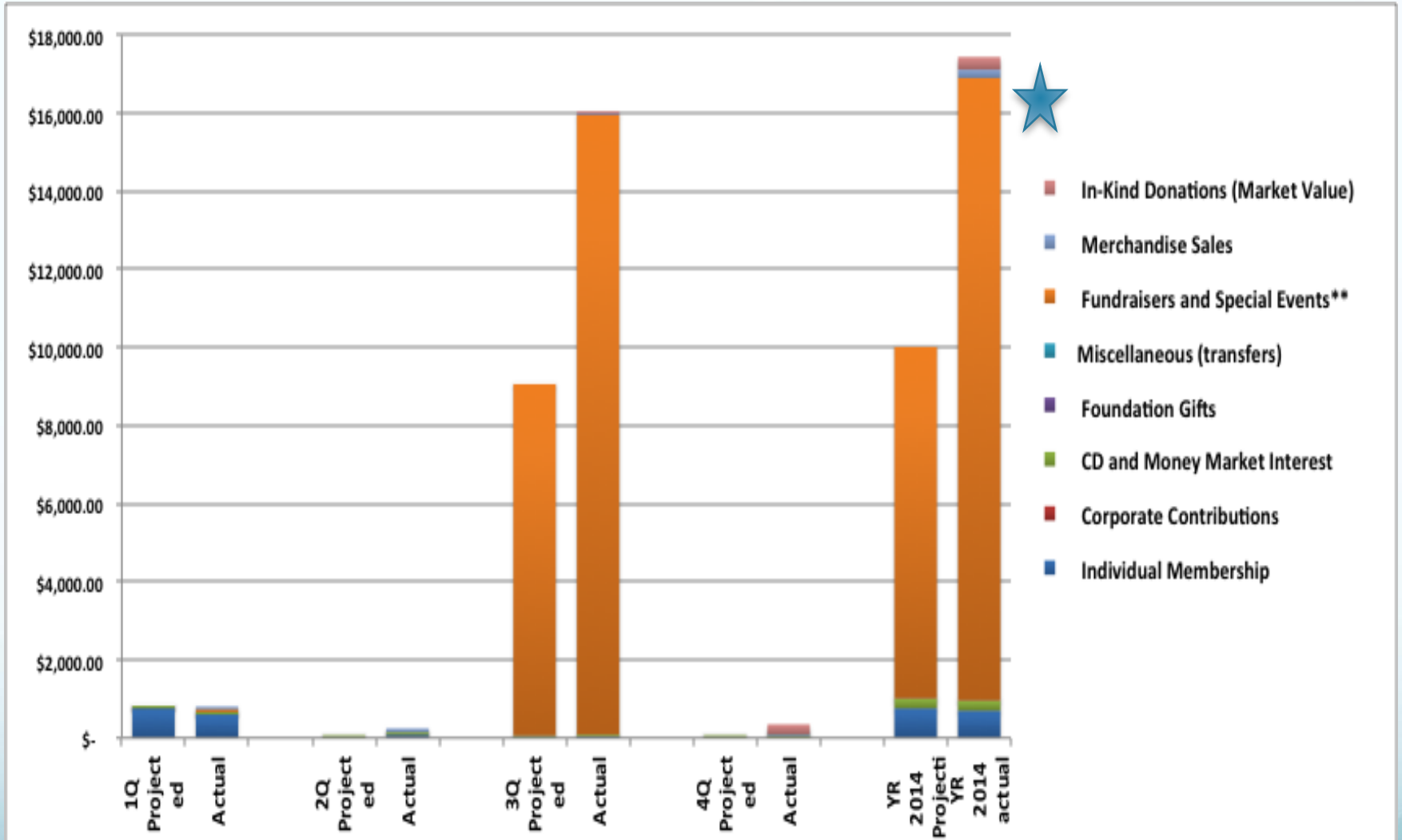
Fortuna Tierra - 2014
